2020 AZMN ROYAL RANGERS MEGA CAMP

The year 2020 is proving to be a challenging year for those in ministry... event cancellations, government orders and community unrest. But this one thing is still true - God is still in control! He is not on His throne wringing His hands and wondering what to do next. Proverbs 19:21 tells us "Many are the plans of a man, but it is the purpose of the Lord that will stand."

Since the COVID19 pandemic that so dramatically affected us in March 2020, virtually right after the National Royal Rangers LEAD conference, the following event changes occurred:

- FCF Spring Parley was cancelled.
- All Royal Rangers Leadership Training events were cancelled through May 2020.
- District Camp was cancelled.
- FCF Family Camp was cancelled.
- Royal Rangers National Camp at Eagle Rock was moved to a future date.
- · April District Staff meeting was cancelled
- Regional Commander's Conference was postponed.
- District Commander's Conference was postponed.
- NRMC in Payson, AZ was cancelled.
- Shooting Sports Action Camp was cancelled.

When the Arizona government allowed the re-opening of public gatherings in May 2020, such as church meetings and other social meetings, the AZMN Royal Rangers executive team immediately got their heads together and started planning a camp to get the ministry together for the year 2020. The decision was made to combine five camps into one - what is called the "Mega Camp". These include: FCF Spring Parley, District Camp, FCF Family Camp, Sectional Fall Camps and FCF Winter Trace.

Mega Camp is a blend of all these camps and will include:

- Royal Rangers outposts (boys from Discovery Rangers and up and Leaders)
- FCF Family Camp, including any families from outposts that want to attend
- A mixture of the events and schedules that typically occur at all of these events

Mega Camp is moved to the Calabasas Group campsite near Rio Rico, AZ. The camp is about 6 miles West of Rio Rico, AZ. Make plans now to attend with your outposts and church family. *Bring your pastors and church leaders.* Most of all, bring an expectant heart, because God is going to move in the lives of His children.

By the way, patches for Spring Parley, District Camp and Family Camp were all ordered and still unissued. Attendees at Mega Camp will get one, two or all three patches depending on what they qualify for! Look for pictures of all three in this booklet.

COVID-19 PROTECTIVE MEASURES

As our good governor stated, COVID-19 is not going away. We need to learn to live with it. This is not in any way diminishing the virus and its seriousness - it is just a fact of life. The AZMN Royal Rangers are committed to running an event that does everything possible to ensure the safety of our district in accordance with the latest recommendations by state and national health experts. Here are the measures the staff is taking to ensure the best and safest possible result for Mega Camp:

- First off, if you are sick (exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19), or suspect you have been exposed to anyone that was sick with the virus within 14 days leading up to the camp, DO NOT ATTEND. If you travelled outside the U.S. within 14 days leading up to the camp, DO NOT ATTEND.
- To the extent possible, we will practice social distancing while at camp. This includes waiting lines at events, social gatherings such as meals and services, and any other group settings.
- Masks should be brought to camp. Since we are outdoors, mask
 wearing will not be mandated UNLESS a person is within 6' of another
 for any extended period of time. Anyone 5 years or older should have a
 mask with them at all times, or with their parents/leaders should the
 need arise.
- Each outpost is responsible for bringing extra masks and hand sanitizer for their outpost use. Water and soap should be available for everyone to wash their hands, and hand washing should be encouraged before meals.
- Campers should cover their mouths when sneezing or coughing, or cough into their elbow.
- Outposts/families should use care in the preparation and serving of meals. The use of gloves and masks while preparing food should be standard practice. Keeping a clean and sanitary kitchen are important.
- Temperatures of every camper attending (forehead scan) will be taken when campers arrive, and before each service. If someone is found to have a temperature (in accordance with CDC guidelines), they will be quarantined and control measures taken.
- If someone is found to have a temperature or becomes ill while at camp (COVID-19 symptoms), they should be brought to the medical lodge where they will be quarantined. If it is a kid, their parents will bring them home immediately, or be called to come and get them. If a leader or adult becomes ill, they will need to leave immediately. Outposts need to ensure they have a sufficient number of leaders or adults to tend to their kids should an adult/leader need to leave.

MEGA CAMP THEME

God is our Warrior *Exodus 15:3*



Campsite Information:

Located in the Coronado National Forest in southern Arizona, Calabasas is home to a variety of ecosystems. The camp is located a short distance off Ruby Road near Pena Blanca Lake, 67 miles south of Tucson and 14 miles northwest of Nogales, AZ.

The campsite has one building with two bathrooms, and some additional porta-potties will be available. The site has several campsites that are spread out amongst a stand of oak trees within a shallow grassy valley. There are several tables and fire rings inside the campsite.

The campsite is at 4,000 feet elevation, and temperatures should be in the high 70's to low 80's during the day and down to the 50's at night. Shade may be limited, so plan on bringing canopies and shade for yourself. Also, don't plan on getting to the campsite too early, our reservation starts at 12:00 on Friday.

Water is not available on site, so bring plenty of your own drinking water. The camp will provide a 200 gallon water tank that can be used for drinking, but serves better to clean dishes and wash up. Plan on bringing mosquito repellant and sunscreen.

There are NO RV hookups, but there is plenty of room for campers to bring along an RV to dry camp. No additional charge for RV's! There is NO trash disposal available at the campsite, so plan on taking your trash home with you. Keep your campsites cleaned up at all times to minimize the chance of critters visiting camp.

There are no pets allowed at all at Calabasas campsite. There are no exceptions, so don't ask and don't bring one.

MEGA CAMP 2020 ELIGIBILITY

For Royal Rangers Outposts:

- Mega Camp is open to boys who are in Discovery Rangers (3rd-5th grades) through Expedition Rangers (High School).
- Ranger Kids (K-2nd grades) can attend only if their dad is a Commander, and is attending Mega Camp with his outpost.
- Every male 18 and older must have a signed medical/consent form to attend Mega Camp. The form is included with this booklet.
- Every male under 18 years of age must have a signed medical/consent form to attend Mega Camp. The form is included with this booklet.
- Copies of ALL Royal Rangers medical/consent forms must be handed in on site when finalizing the registration process. Original forms should remain with the outpost leaders for use during camp and when traveling.

For Families Attending with Outpost:

- Family members from any outposts attending are welcome as long as they fully comply with the requirements of the staff.
- Girls are allowed to attend ONLY IF they have a parent(s) in attendance. Girls that do attend must sleep with their family not in a separate girls tent.
- Families will camp in the same area as their sponsoring outposts. It will be the responsibility of the sponsoring outposts to ensure:
 - National Royal Rangers requirements for sleeping arrangements for boys and leaders are maintained.
 - Boys are not lodging with girls UNLESS they are family members (brother/sister) AND sleeping with their parent(s).
 - Royal Ranger boys in attendance but not with their family are not allowed to lodge with other adults or families not their own.
- Every family member adult (men AND women) must also complete the medical/consent form and turn a copy of it in to the staff when finalizing their registration on site.
- Every family member minor (boys AND girls) must complete the medical/consent form in this booklet for minors, and turn a copy of it in to the staff when finalizing their registration on site.
- NO DOGS or any other pets are allowed at the campsite. Period.

INSURANCE: In the event any camper being injured while in attendance, they must obtain an insurance form from the Health & Safety Officer and notify the District Director before leaving the camp for medical treatment.

EVENING WORSHIP and CHURCH SERVICE: *Everyone* at Mega Camp will be required to attend the Saturday evening worship service and Sunday church service. We owe this to God, our Pastors, and ourselves.

EVENTS

Main Rule: As with any Royal Ranger boys participating in any of these events, an adult must be present for any kids that want to participate. Children will NOT be allowed to do the following without either an outpost leader or adult directly responsible in attendance: Shoot any weapon (.22, Archery, etc), throw knife or hawk, start a fire with flint & steel, or participate in any other physical events at the camp.

FCF Village: The FCF Village includes blacksmithing, leatherwork, hawk and knife throwing, flint and steel and several displays. Additionally, there will be a trading post for kids to trade money or items for cool things.

Archery: An archery range is available for all ages.

Shooting Range: A shooting range will be set up IF safe to do so. BB guns or pellet guns will be available for all ages. A range safety officer will be present to ensure all safety rules are followed. All minors must have an adult in attendance.

Knife & Hawk: A full knife and hawk walk is planned for FCF members, and extra blocks will be set up in the FCF village for anyone that wants to have some fun. Remember, Rangers and all other kids must have an adult with them.

Flint & Steel: A flint & steel event is planned for all FCF members. Additionally, any kids with adult supervision are welcome to try their hand at striking a flame! Availability depends on forest service fire restrictions.

Additional Camp Events: Some other fun events and competitions are planned. Prizes will be awarded at the ceremony after church on Sunday.

Sectional Events: Each section will bring one event that is set up in the central space designated for events. If the section wants to track and award prizes for event participation, they may award prizes during the Sunday morning awards ceremony.

Snack Bar: On Saturday during the event time a snack bar is available, so bring extra money if you want to keep your energy level up!

District Event/Big E: Given the mixture of participants at Mega Camp, the Big E competition will not be awarded this year. There will be no campsite judging or district event typically used for the Big E.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Health is everyone's responsibility.

There is always a very good chance that we will not be able to have campfires due to fire danger.

You will need to be prepared to use Gas Fire Stoves only.

- 1. <u>In the event of high fire danger, No Campfires!!</u> Commanders, your supervision is necessary to insure a safe Mega Camp for your outpost and the total encampment. The safety committee will be checking each campsite.
- 2. Safety First!! <u>DO NOT</u> throw pine cones, rocks, or any other objects outside of competition activities. People could get hurt very easily.
- 3. An emergency care consent form for all children under 18 must be available to the Outpost Commander at all times.
- 4. If anybody needs to take medicine, they must bring a note signed by his parents stating the name of the medicine and the time it must be taken. The note and medicine must be in the possession of his Outpost Coordinator.
- 5. Don't use gasoline or kerosene lamps in your tents. Use only flashlights. Tents will burn quickly.
- 6. Use the *Adventures in Camping Handbook* for guidelines on Fire craft, Tool craft, Safety, and Sanitation.
- 7. No firearms are allowed in the camp other than those used for competition events.
- 8. If anyone gets hurt, bring him to the First Aid Station with his emergency care consent form. Anyone injured at the Mega Camp <u>MUST</u> obtain an insurance form from the District Staff or the Health & Safety Officer. This form must accompany the injured person to the hospital or doctor for treatment. Failure to follow this procedure will result in <u>YOU</u> paying the cost of treatment.
- 9. It is <u>REQUIRED</u> that every adult, 18 years of age and older, complete the Medical/Consent form and turn in a copy at the registration table upon arriving to Mega Camp.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- 1. **EVENT RESPONSIBILITY:** The various Sections will each run an event. NOTE: Each section is responsible to bring the equipment necessary to run their event.
- 2. All outposts must have their campsites inspected for cleanliness before receiving their patches and leaving the Mega Camp site on Sunday.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

REGISTRATION: It is strongly recommended that outposts register on-line. On-line registration can be completed by going to the District website and clicking on the Events tab, then finding the link to register on-line. On-line registration will require a credit card.

You must have the following items when checking in at Mega Camp:

- A list of children by Outpost Age Group and/or family. (Held by Outpost Senior Coordinator)
- A properly signed medical/consent form for each child under age 18. <u>NO EXCEPTIONS</u>. (Held by Outpost Senior Coordinator)
- A signed copy of the medical/consent form for each adult 18 years of age and older (Left at the District Registration table)
 - 1. Please be accurate on your pre-registration. No refunds can be made at the camp. The staff will make every effort to connect overpayments by outposts with other outposts needing to pay for extra campers.
 - 2. Bring ONE check for any unpaid registration fees. See REGISTRATION FORM for accurate fees. Please understand that the registration fee covers insurance, all awards, speakers, District Camp patches, campsite rental and other necessary costs.
 - 3. Pre-registration is highly encouraged to allow District Staff to make accurate planning in details. Pre-registration is done by registering on-line by clicking on the link provided on the District Camp event at www.azroyalrangers.com or by completing the registration form in the camp booklet.
 - 4. MAKE CHECKS PAYABLE TO "AZ MINISTRY NETWORK"

Remember, every camper's temperature will be checked when arriving at camp.
