2025 AZMN ROYAL RANGERS NETWORK CAMP/PARLEY

This year the AZMN Royal Rangers ministry is excited to announce the joining of two successful camps: Network Camp AND FCF Spring Parley. Network Camp includes tons of exciting activities and adventure, such as shooting sports (small-bore and archery), obstacle course, sports competitions and special outpost challenges. FCF Spring Parley is typically the campout that new FCF members complete the Frontier Adventure to enter FCF. The Frontier Adventure will be completed at this camp and integrated into other camp activities. In addition, an FCF Village and activities (hawk and knife throwing, blacksmithing, leathermaking) are available for all campers in attendance.

Our theme for this year's Network Camp is "Transformed – Not Conformed". The main Bible verse for the theme is Romans 12:2. A special two-part patch is available for the event. For all non-FCF campers in attendance, the main part of the patch is included in the registration cost. For all FCF members, a complimentary second part of the patch is available which makes a larger two-part patch which is shown below.

Campsite Information:

Mega Camp is scheduled at Camp Raymond near Parks, AZ. The camp is about 20 miles West of Flagstaff, AZ, and South of I-40. The camp is situated at 6,700 feet above sea level, and it can get cold at night. Royal Rangers enjoy a great relationship with the camp and Ranger Rick is excited to make this a special event! So. Make plans now to attend with your outposts. ***Bring your pastors and church leaders.*** Most of all, bring an expectant heart, because God is going to move in the lives of His children.

Trash and water are available at the campsite, but wood is not readily available, so bring your own. Keep your campsites cleaned up at all times to minimize the chance of critters visiting camp.

There are no pets allowed at all at Camp Raymond, so don't bring any pets. There are no exceptions, so don't ask and don't bring one.

MEGA CAMP 2025 ELIGIBILITY

For Royal Rangers Outposts:

- Camp is open to boys who are in Discovery Rangers (3rd-5th grades) through Expedition Rangers (High School).
- Ranger Kids (K-2nd grades) can attend only if their dad is a Commander and is attending Camp with his outpost.
- Every male 18 and older must have a signed medical/consent form to attend Camp. The form is available on the network website: www.azroyalrangers.com.
- Every male under 18 years of age must have a signed medical/consent form to attend Camp. The form is available on the network website: www.azroyalrangers.com.
- Copies of ALL Royal Rangers medical/consent forms must be handed in on site when finalizing the registration process. Original forms should remain with the outpost leaders for use during camp and when traveling.

INSURANCE: In the event any camper being injured while in attendance, they must obtain an insurance form from the Health & Safety Officer and notify the District Director before leaving the camp for medical treatment.

EVENING WORSHIP and CHURCH SERVICE: *Everyone* at Camp will be required to attend the Saturday evening worship service and Sunday church service. We owe this to God, our Pastors, and ourselves.

EVENTS

Main Rule: *As with any Royal Ranger boys participating in any of these events, an adult must be present for any kids that want to participate. Children will NOT be allowed to do the following without either an outpost leader or adult directly responsible in attendance: Shoot any weapon (.22, Archery, etc), throw knife or hawk, start a fire with flint & steel, or participate in any other physical events at the camp.*

FCF Village: The FCF Village includes blacksmithing, leatherwork, hawk and knife throwing, flint and steel and several displays. Additionally, there will be a trading post for kids to trade money or items for cool things.

Archery: An archery range is available for all ages.

Shooting Range: A shooting range will be set up IF safe to do so. BB guns or pellet guns will be available for all ages. A range safety officer will be present to ensure all safety rules are followed. All minors must have an adult in attendance.

Knife & Hawk: A full knife and hawk walk is planned for FCF members, and extra blocks will be set up in the FCF village for anyone that wants to have some fun. Remember, Rangers and all other kids must have an adult with them.

Flint & Steel: A flint & steel event is planned for all FCF members. Additionally, any kids with adult supervision are welcome to try their hand at striking a flame! Availability depends on forest service fire restrictions.

Additional Camp Events: Some other fun events and competitions are planned. Prizes will be awarded at the ceremony after church on Sunday.

Outpost Events: Each outpost is encouraged to bring one event that is set up in the central space designated for events. If the outpost wants to track and award prizes for event participation, they may award prizes during the Sunday morning awards ceremony.

Snack Bar: On Saturday during the event time a snack bar is available, so bring extra money if you want to keep your energy level up!

Network Event/Big E: The Big E award is prestigious. The award is given to the outpost that embodies the following characteristics during camp: participation, camp craft, outpost spirit, camp cleanliness and advancement (FCF).

FCF Information

Frontier Adventure: For those wanting to enter Frontiersman Camping Fellowship, go to the AZMN Royal Ranger page and download the application, letter and workbook. Applications for FCF must be received by April 9, 2025, with a check made out to Arizona Ministry Network.

Buckskin and Wilderness: Buckskin testing only will be completed on site on Saturday, May 3, 2025. Go to the AZMN Royal Ranger page and download the Buckskin application, letter and workbook. Applications must be received by April 9, 2025, with a check made out to Arizona Ministry Network. Wilderness testing will not be available at this camp, but available at the July 2025 Territorial Rendezvous in Arizona.

Scout Testing: Young Bucks that want to test for Sectional Scout may download the scout package off the network website. Forms and reference letters must be completed and brought to camp.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Health is everyone's responsibility.

There is always a very good chance that we will not be able to have campfires due to fire danger.
You will need to be prepared to use Gas Fire Stoves only.

1. **In the event of high fire danger, No Campfires!!** Commanders, your supervision is necessary to insure a safe camp for your outpost and the total encampment. The safety committee will be checking each campsite.
2. **Safety First!! DO NOT** throw pine cones, rocks, or any other objects outside of competition activities. People could get hurt very easily.
3. An emergency care consent form for all children under 18 must be available to the Outpost Commander at all times.
4. If anybody needs to take medicine, they must bring a note signed by his parents stating the name of the medicine and the time it must be taken. The note and medicine must be in the possession of his Outpost Coordinator.
5. Don't use gasoline or kerosene lamps in your tents. Use only flashlights. Tents will burn quickly.
6. Use the *Adventures in Camping Handbook* for guidelines on Fire craft, Tool craft, Safety, and Sanitation.
7. No firearms are allowed in the camp other than those used for competition events.
8. If anyone gets hurt, bring him to the First Aid Station with his emergency care consent form. Anyone injured at Camp **MUST** obtain an insurance form from the Network Staff or the Health & Safety Officer. This form must accompany the injured person to the hospital or doctor for treatment. Failure to follow this procedure will result in **YOU** paying the cost of treatment.
9. It is **REQUIRED** that every adult, 18 years of age and older, complete the Medical/Consent form and turn in a copy at the registration table upon arriving to camp.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

1. **EVENT RESPONSIBILITY:** The various Divisions will each run an event. NOTE: Each division is responsible to bring the equipment necessary to run their event.
2. All outposts must have their campsites inspected for cleanliness before receiving their patches and leaving the site on Sunday.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

REGISTRATION: It is strongly recommended that outposts register ahead of time. Registering before the deadline is the best way to keep outpost costs down.

You must have the following items when checking in at Camp:

- A list of children by Outpost Age Group and/or family. (Held by Outpost Senior Coordinator)
 - A properly signed medical/consent form for each child under age 18. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** (Held by Outpost Senior Coordinator)
 - A signed copy of the medical/consent form for each adult 18 years of age and older (Left at the Registration table)
1. Please be accurate on your pre-registration. No refunds can be made at the camp. The staff will make every effort to connect overpayments by outposts with other outposts needing to pay for extra campers.
 2. Bring ONE check for any unpaid registration fees. See REGISTRATION FORM for accurate fees. Please understand that the registration fee covers insurance, all awards, speakers, Camp patches, campsite rental and other necessary costs.
 3. Pre-registration is highly encouraged to allow Network Staff to accurately plan for camp. Pre-registration is done by completing the registration form in the camp booklet by the date on the form. If you do not send in a registration by the date on the form, then DO NOT send in one late – just bring the form to camp and register on site.

(Example: if you registered 12 people ahead of time, you could bring an extra 3 people up to camp and register on site for \$50 each. Any above the 25% would be at \$60/each.)

Directions to Camp Raymond near Parks, AZ:

- From Flagstaff, AZ head West on I-40 towards Williams, AZ for about 17 miles.
- Take Exit 178 at Parks Rd. and turn left at the top of the offramp.
- Travel South on Goose Prairie Rd for about 8.2 miles. Towards the end, the road will bend 90 degrees to the right.
- Turn left at Boy Scout Camp Road. Camp Raymond is about 0.8 miles.
- Drive carefully on the road South of I-40. Some of the road is gravel so control your speed.
